CASA stands for "Court Appointed Special Advocate", the official name for a volunteer who speaks up for a child's best interest. Volunteers are trained to become advocates for children and make recommendations to the judge and Court. The Volunteer meets with the child on a regular basis, perhaps at school, or in a foster home, or wherever the child is currently Living



Delaware County CASA

Delaware County CASA is comprised of approximately 70 volunteers who serve as the eyes and ears of the court. Our CASA Volunteer participate in more than 30 hours of training so they can responsibly advocate for what is in the best interest of each abused and neglected child who is removed from their home. The volunteer will talk with the child, family, social workers, teachers, and medical providers who know the child.






Donations to CASA
